ILLUSTRATOR: Graffiti Tag

LEARNING TARGETS

- Discuss whether graffiti is art.
- Discuss history of graffiti and how it can affect the community.
- Use the Pen tool in Illustrator to draw an original graffiti tag with a focus on Shape, Movement and Emphasis.



PROCESS

- 1. Brainstorm and draft some ideas for a graffiti tag. Create a revised draft that includes color.
- Create a final pencil drawing of your graffiti tag on paper. Use black marker/pen to ink over your lines. Do not color your drawing, but do include color swatches. Erase the pencil lines.
- 3. **Scan** to your computer or take a picture of your drawing.
- 4. Create a **new** Illustrator document. Choose <u>File > Place</u> to **insert** your drawing picture onto the Artboard.
- 5. Lock the layer with your drawing, then create a **new layer**.
- 6. Use the **Pen tool** to trace the shapes of the letters, creating a new shape for each letter.
- 7. Apply **Fill** and **Stroke** colors to your shapes (adjust the weight of the stroke).
- 8. Delete/hide the layer with your drawing. Choose File > Export... to save your document as a PNG image.
- 9. Upload your PNG image to CANVAS.
