

# Dreamweaver: Me Website

## Multimedia I

### LEARNING OBJECTIVE(S)

- Use Dreamweaver to create a website with four (4) HTML pages about you, your family and your friends.
- Focus on creating **Unity** with your pages through **Color, Emphasis and Balance**.

### GETTING STARTED

1. Create a new folder on your device named "Me Website" and also create a sub-folder titled "images".
2. Save all of the images you want to use into your "images" folder. Using Photoshop, choose Image > Image Size... to resize your images to make them smaller - **make sure the resolution is 72 pixels/inch**.
3. Create a new HTML (HTML 4.01) document in Dreamweaver and save into your folder as "index.html". Choose Site > New Site... to create a new site for this assignment.
4. Using Design view in Dreamweaver, design your webpage to include the requirements listed below.
5. When your webpage is complete, navigate to the folder on your device. Right-click on the folder that contains your website and choose Send to > Compressed (zipped) folder (*this will create a single ZIP file that contains the HTML document and images for your webpage*).
6. Upload the ZIP file to CANVAS.

### REQUIRED

- ✓ All **font** must be formatted with **CSS**
- ✓ At least one (1) **rollover image**
- ✓ At least one (1) **external link** to another website
- ✓ At least one (1) **email link**
- ✓ At least one (1) **image** on each page
- ✓ At least one (1) **table** on each page
- ✓ **Background** (color or image) on each page
- ✓ **Navigation** (links to all other pages) on each page
- ✓ Four (4) HTML pages:
  - **index.html** (your home page)
  - **me.html** (page about you)
  - **family.html** (page about your family)
  - **friends.html** (page about your friends)
